At the writing of this newsletter article, the COVID infection rates have continued to climb to 3% of Saguache population and Rio Grande has already reached 3% which means we are officially in the orange phase of COVID protocols. It is the recommendation of both our bishop and our governor that we have virtual services instead of in person services. We have decided to follow these recommendations. While the church may be closed to activities and in-person worship, Hannah and I will still be working at the church in our respective offices so it will not be a complete shutdown. We will still be sending out the weekly letter and Cooking for your Neighbor will continue. These are certainly difficult times.

During this time, we rejoice in the testimony of our sister Isabel Geibel as she celebrates her one hundredth birthday December 3rd. Because of COVID there can't be any party as such and she has resigned herself to that, but I think we can honor her, not only for her military service but also her faithful commitment to Center. We can do this by flooding her with special birthday cards. You may wish to mail them, but we would love it if you would leave them at the church or join us in a parade. If weather is permitting, I am planning to leave the Center church at noon on December 3rd and invite any who would like to join me in their cars. We drive to her house in the mountains forming a parade, honking our horns, and delivering a personal birthday cake with birthday cards, then head our separate ways. If the weather is good enough to do this, I think this would be a wonderful way to let Ms. Isabel know we are thinking of her on her 100th birthday in spite of COVID. During these holiday seasons there are many on our prayer list, so let us remember to lift them in prayer daily. With all the loss in both Center and Saguache, this year we will have a Blue Christmas service on the longest night of the year, December 21st. As with our services, Blue Christmas service will be via zoom and Facebook Live and if we are able we will also have in person service that evening at 6:30 pm. Our special Christmas Eve service will be via Zoom at 5 pm in Saguache and via Zoom and in person at 7 pm in Center. All in person services are subject to COVID outbreak percentages and may be virtual only should the numbers not decline.

Our November 18th Zoom Charge Conference went very well and most people who were involved liked it much better than the cluster conferences. We celebrated how God has blessed us this year even in a pandemic.

Last year we started Adopt a Veteran for special gifts for our Homelake Veterans. This year we will have to do it a little differently. We are continuing our tradition of adopting a veteran from Homelake, and we invite you to participate with us! As with anything this year, there is a COVID twist. We have one hundred 10" X 8.45" brown gifts bags that we would like to be filled with items that are basic necessities but might be hard for them to get good quality of during these times. Items to include in the bag: (All items must be non-fragrant and non-gender specific): shampoo, deodorant, lotion, chapstick or lip balm, tissues, toothbrush, toothpaste, bar of soap and a Christmas card.

Peppermint Bark

I ngredients

december.

- 8 oz semi-sweet chocolate (broken)
- 2 tsps. Canola oil

- 1/2 tsp peppermint extract
- 8 oz white chocolate (broken)
- 25 peppermint candies (crushed)

Directions

- 1. Lightly grease a 9 x 9 inch pan and line with waxed paper, smoothing out wrinkles; set aside.
- 2. Place the semisweet chocolate and 1 teaspoon of the canola oil in the top of a double boiler over just barely simmering water, stirring frequently and scraping down the sides with a rubber spatula to avoid scorching. When the chocolate is melted, stir in 1/4 teaspoon of the peppermint extract. Pour the melted chocolate into the prepared pan, and spread evenly over the bottom of the pan. Sprinkle half of the crushed peppermints over the chocolate layer. Refrigerate until completely hardened, about 1 hour.
- 3. Place the white chocolate and the remaining 1 teaspoon canola oil in the top of a double boiler over just barely simmering water, stirring frequently and scraping down the sides with a rubber spatula to avoid scorching. When the chocolate is melted, stir in the remaining 1/4 teaspoon peppermint extract. Pour the white chocolate directly over the semisweet chocolate layer; spread evenly. Sprinkle the remaining crushed candy over the top and gently press in. Refrigerate until completely hardened. Remove from pan; break into small pieces to serve.
