## Greetings and Grace and Peace from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ,

Thank you to all you who joined our 8:30 am Zoom worship as well as those who joined via Facebook Live, Zoom, or in person for our 10:30 am morning worship. I appreciate Linda Clutter for being our online liturgist and for Janet Myers for being our in-person liturgist. Thank you all so much for your willingness to serve. What a blessing to see everyone in worship. I do appreciate the kindness and grace of all of those who were present virtually Sunday. I tried to make the church as Christmassy as I could because I know how difficult it is not to be present personally in worship.

Let us join in prayer for safety as the Pfizer vaccine and Moderna vaccine are distributed and given to health care workers and later to those in nursing homes and assisted living facilities and front-line workers. We continue to follow protocols of mask wearing, social distancing, and staying away from crowds, temperature monitoring, with the addition of a personal waiver for those who wish to join our in-person activities. Please know that we will maintain our protocols we have in place to ensure we are safely gathered. Please know that if you have been around anyone that has been ill or if you feel under the weather, please stay home and join us virtually if you can.

We will be able to have in-person Blue Christmas service on the longest night, December 21, 2020 at 6:30 pm in the Center UMC sanctuary. I would invite you to join us either virtually or in person, especially if you have lost a loved one this year. Another thing very special this year on December 21st is that you can witness something that hasn't been seen in nearly 800 years – the "Christmas Star" or "Star of Bethlehem" as it has been called. Two planets haven't appeared this relatively close together from Earth's vantage point since the Middle Ages. Patrick Hartigan, astronomer at Rice University told Forbes "You'd have to go all the way back to before dawn on March 4, 1226, to see a closer alignment between these objects visible in the night sky." Stargazers in the northern hemisphere should turn their heads and telescopes to the southwest portion of the sky about 45 minutes after sunset to see the planets align December 21. However, reportedly sightings can be seen throughout that entire week. What a Christmas blessing to see the Bethlehem Star reminding us of that first Christmas night in Bethlehem when God came down to earth in a tiny babe named Jesus. What a wonderful reminder that God is with us and has always been and will always be with you.

We do tentatively we plan to have Saguache UMC's Christmas Eve candle lighting service virtually and in-person with protocols in place December 24<sup>th</sup> at 5 pm followed by Center UMC's service virtually and in-person with protocols in place at 7 pm. Please pray that our numbers stay low and that we are able to do this safely.

We finish our Advent Study this Wednesday evening, December 23rd at 6:30pm via our Zoom link, as we will conclude our Adam Hamilton's Advent Study *Incarnation*. We hope you will join us.

These are meant to develop our acts of piety through prayer, reading scripture, and daily devotions. On Wednesday Adam Hamilton's Advent Study Incarnation began December 2nd and is open to anyone who wishes to join using our Zoom platform. Please let Hannah or me know so we can get you the book for the study. Remember the Zoom platform can be accessed by a telephone; you don't have to have internet or a computer to participate; you just dial the number.
