The Twelve Disciples

Who was Judas Iscariot?

The Apostle that we are focusing on this month is Judas Iscariot. Everyone knows him as the betrayer of Jesus, the man who gave up Jesus to the soldiers for 30 pieces of silver. His name has become synonymous with traitor and the idiom "a Judas kiss" is used to refer to a traitorous act disguised as affection. In the Gospel of John it is revealed that he was the treasurer for the disciples and "he used to help himself to what was put into it." (John 12:6) Many believe his greediness is what led to his betrayal of Jesus while others point to the Devil being the root cause. However, Scholars have discovered a possible third option: Jesus asked him to do so.

A few years ago an ancient papyrus document surfaced as what is now known as the Gospel of Judas. It dates back to about the year 300 AD and is written in ancient Greek. As a way of authenticating it, they used another document that was written by St. Irenaeus in the year 180 AD. This document was a condemnation of the Gospel of Judas. Its authenticity is still debated amongst scholars since the document depicts such a contrasting view of what the other gospels have recorded. But the most interesting part is that while it seems contrary to the other gospels, the key parts written in the Gospel of Judas are possible.

"The star that leads the way is your star,' Jesus said to Judas...
'You will exceed all of them for you will have sacrificed the man that clothes me". No one was with Jesus and Judas when this was possibly discussed so it is possible this was all hidden from the other disciples.

Now, whether the Gospel of Judas is Authentic or it is just an elaborate hoax, one thing is for certain: Judas' betrayal led to Jesus being crucified so that he could die for us. Jesus had to die so that he could save the world from sin. Jesus also knew he would be betrayed. Jesus did not fear his betrayal, he only prepared his disciples for when it would come to pass. This was God's will, and even if Satan attempted to ruin God's plan through Judas, this just shows how impossible that is. In Luke 23:34 Jesus pleads, "Father forgive them, they know not what they do". Jesus spoke this of the soldiers who were putting him on the cross, but could this not apply to Judas as well? Jesus spoke of forgiveness, and whether or not the Gospel of Judas is true, I believe Jesus would have forgiven Judas, so why shouldn't we?

- 1/4 cup diced green bell pepper

- 2 cups milk
- 16oz package frozen hashbrowns

Directions

- 1. Preheat oven to 350 degrees F (175 degrees C). Lightly grease a 7x11 inch casserole dish.
- Fry the bacon in a large, deep skillet over medium-high heat until evenly browned, about 10 minutes. Drain on a paper towel-lined plate. Crumble.
- 3. In a large bowl beat together eggs and milk. Mix in cheese, bacon, onion and green pepper. Stir in the thawed hash browns. Pour mixture into prepared casserole.
- 4. Cover with aluminum foil and bake in preheated oven for 45 minutes. Uncover and bake for another 30 minutes until eggs have set.




