

There was also much sadness as 40 some churches were disaffiliated. The majority of which were from Trinity district and many that were labeled "to be determined" when assignments were made.

Because we are being re-districted, many felt the pain of change and one, from the front range area of my home town, had a Pastor who appealed NOT to be added to the Wyoming district when they identified themselves as part of the front range. And he said "I am not sure I can sell this to my people." Denver area front range churches questioned the 'traveling distance' through heavily congested roads and how the distance between would stifle connectivity. I tell you this NOT to be negative, but to remind us all that yes, change is hard and harder for some than others.

There were many joyful times also as folks celebrated their successes. Fresh Expressions ideas that I gleaned were ideas of book clubs, fire pits, coffee shops and even one in a bar. 


Table for All Grant

Strawberry-Cabernet Barbecue Sauce

Want to make July 4 feel extra special? This homemade barbecue sauce takes just 1/2 hour to make, and the combo of fresh berries and wine give it a flavor that'll knock the socks off the bottled stuff. We love it on chicken, pork, and anywhere else you'd add a good sauce.

Ingredients

- 1 tbsp. canola oil
- 1/2 medium onion, chopped
- Kosher salt and freshly ground black pepper
- 4 oz. strawberries, trimmed
 and quartered (about 3/4 cup)
- 1/2 c. Cabernet Sauvignon
- 1/3 c. apple cider vinegar

- 1/4 c. sugar
- 1/4 c. ketchup
- 2 tbsp. Worcestershire sauce
- 1 +bsp. pure maple syrup
- 3 cloves garlic, chopped
- 1/2 to 1 jalapeño, seeded and diced

Directions

- 1. Heat oil in a medium saucepan over medium heat. Add onion and season with salt and pepper. Cook, stirring occasionally, until golden brown, 7 to 9 minutes. Stir in strawberries and Cabernet Sauvignon. Increase heat to medium-high, and cook until berries soften, 3 to 4 minutes. Add vinegar, sugar, ketchup, Worcestershire, maple syrup, garlic, and jalapeño. Bring to a boil. Reduce heat, and simmer until slightly thickened, 8 to 12 minutes. Let cool slightly.
- 2. Transfer mixture to a blender and puree until smooth (or use an immersion blender directly in the pan), about 30 seconds. Return to pan and simmer, if necessary, until sauce thickens, 1 to 2 minutes. Let cool, and use to baste grilled chicken, ribs, or pork chops.
